The Wars We All Fight: Flesh vs Spirit An Exposition of Romans #4 Romans 7:21-25; 8:1-2, 5-8, and 14-17


We can sum up what we've learned thus far about the Gospel in Romans with three phrases: (1) Lost without a Savior; (2) But Jesus; (3) Peace with God. None of these precious truths, however, will exempt us from the battles we face as Christians with the flesh. And we can't win them without help from the Spirit of God.

Gospel Principle #4


Our old nature, called the flesh, rages against us internally even though we are Christians. And we are powerless to defeat it without help from the Spirit of God.

- 1. War of the Will (7:21)
 - a. Flesh Victory from self-determination and self-will to do better
 - b. Spirit Victory from determination and will of another person Jesus
 - c. Prayer I can't; you can.
- 2. War of the Conscience (7:22-24; 8:1-2)
 - a. Flesh Tearing down of self via guilt
 - b. Spirit Building up redemptively via identification and correction
 - c. Prayer Be patient with me, Lord, as we walk hand in hand together in this.
- 3. War of Moral Superiority (8:5-8)
 - a. Flesh Aiming to correct another's behavior through active or passive aggression or condemnation
 - b. Spirit Revelation from God that immorality stems from irreverence.
 - c. Prayer Only you are big enough to save and change someone, Lord.
- 4. War of Insecurity (8:14-17)
 - a. Flesh Projection that's driven by doubts and fears
 - b. Spirit Adopted. Child of God. Co-Heir with Christ. Abba Father.
 - c. Prayer Thank you, Lord. Now, give me the strength to let me be me.

One More Thing...
Do We Really Need One Another

1 Corinthians 12:12-13

Believers have two responsibilities. The first is to worship God and the second is to work for His kingdom. Where and how we serve is based upon our unique talents, skills, and calling. But the one place where we are all expected to give of ourselves is the local church.

When you were saved, the Lord baptized you by the Holy Spirit into His church—the body of believers who live all over the world but are united by trust in Jesus Christ. You then chose, according to the will of God, to become part of a local, autonomous group of believers. He placed you there because He knows that you are needed (1 Cor. 12:18). You are significant to your home church.

The church is more than a community. It is an interdependent body with individual members who were created by God to function in communion with one another. We Christians, like the world at large, are a diverse group, and that means we often have to strive hard for unity. But our differences are actually something to be celebrated, because each person uniquely contributes to God's purpose. A church that is truly operating as a unit—with all its varied gifts, talents, personalities, and intellects focused toward kingdom goals—must be a beautiful sight before the Lord.
