A Message from Pastor Derrick

Seven Dips In A Muddy Pond The Tale of Seven Lepers #1: Naaman 2 Kings 5:1-19

Here's a challenge for you: Google "leprosy in the Bible." Be prepared, though, because Bible teachers sure have spilled a lot of ink on the subject. Why? Leprosy, a.k.a. Hansen's Disease, was incurable in the days of the Bible apart from a miracle of God. To make matters worse, lepers were viewed as smitten of God and to be avoided and quarantined, not loved and ministered to.

But the main reason leprosy is addressed by biblical writers is because of what it stands for spiritually: sin. And apart from the saving grace of God, it is incurable. Today, we begin our tale of leprosy through the first person ever healed of it: Naaman. And, friend, what a tale it is.

Before the Seventh Dip

- 1. Beautiful and great in eyes of self and others until something went horribly wrong (1-3)
- 2. Desperate for the healing of God, but on his own terms (4-7)
- 3. Humiliated and given the run around to bring him to a choice (8-14)

After the Seventh Dip

- 1. Confession of truth that followed naturally from regeneration (15a)
- 2. Cheerful spirit of generosity and worship (15b-17)
- 3. Grateful, reverent, humble, and peaceful (18-19)


