A Message from Pastor Derrick

You Can't Afford Not to Pray for Our Nation

1 Timothy 2:1-7 For This Reason, I Kneel #6

Consider this: Israel isn't the only "holy land." Because God is sovereign and created the heavens and the earth, all land is holy; ours included. We often like to separate the sacred from the secular. In the world of the Bible though, they are connected and will always be.

That's why we can't afford <u>not</u> to pray for our nation and our world. My prayer today for you is quite simple: that God will compel you to intercede for our nation as well as the people in it <u>according to his character</u>. And in today's message from 1 Timothy 2:1-7, we learn why.

Why?

1. No Separation Between God and State (2:1-2a)

- · Since God is sovereign, all lands are sacred
- · With the office of King came in the office of Prophet
- · Leadership often an indictment of culture; or hope for it. Or both.

2. The Lord can work through those in authority, especially when we pray (2:2b-3)

- Cyrus the Great (Ezra 1:1)
- Nicodemus and Joseph of Arimathea (Jn 19:38-40)


3. Restoration, not Condemnation, is what God has in mind for the world (2:4-6)

- For Tyrants (Nebuchadnezzar)
- For Statesmen (Herod Agrippa)
- For the Externally Wicked (The Samaritan Leper)
- For the Internally Wicked (Nathanael)

4. Helps us know our role in it (2:7)

- Not apostles
- But heralds of the apostolic message

One More Thing ..

The Lord imparts unto us that primary strength of character which makes everything in life work with intensity and decision. We are "strengthened with might by his Spirit in the inner man." And the strength is continuous; reserves of power come to us which we cannot exhaust.

"As thy days, so shall thy strength be"-strength of will, strength of affection, strength of judgment, strength of ideals and achievement.

"The Lord is my strength" to go on. He gives us power to tread the dead level, to walk the long lane that seems never to have a turning, to go through those long reaches of life which afford no pleasant surprise, and which depress the spirits in the sameness of a terrible drudgery.

"The Lord is my strength" to go up. He is to me the power by which I can climb the Hill of Difficulty and not be afraid.

"The Lord is my strength" to go down. It is when we leave the bracing heights, where the wind and the sun have been about us, and when we begin to come down the hill into closer and more sultry spheres, that the heart is apt to grow faint. I heard a man say the other day concerning his growing physical frailty, "It is the coming down that tires me!"

"The Lord is my strength" to sit still. And how difficult is the attainment! Do we not often say to one another, in seasons when we are compelled to be quiet, "If only I could do something!"

When the child is ill, and the mother stands by in comparative helplessness, how severe is the test! But to do nothing, just to sit still and wait, requires tremendous strength.
