## A Message from Pastor Derrick

### The Storms We Sail Into #2 Divine Choreography on the Sea of Galilee Luke 8:22-25

#### Why Jesus Steers Us Into Some Storms:

(1) Because our wrong conceptions, that lead to wrong conclusions and then actions, can only be corrected by a storm

"Master, Master, we're going to drown." (24)

#### Some Wrong Conceptions A Storm Often Corrects

- (a) Jesus will never give me more than I can handle (Consider Moses in Exodus 17:12; and Jesus in Luke 22:42).
- (b) Jesus depends on our rousing in order to care for us (Consider Matthew 5:45).
- (c) Jesus is my savior. Therefore, the storms I face in life will be less than others (Consider the fate of the disciples in light of John 16:33)
- (2) Because the divine choreography of storm and calm are equally necessary for personal and Christian maturity.

"Squall came down on the lake" (23) vs "the storm subsided and all was calm" (24)

#### Why the Storm Is Necessary

- (a) It reveals how dangerous it is to abandoned our spiritual logic, regardless of the condition of the seas.
- (b) If professional fisherman had to turn to a prophet named Jesus to rescue them from their familiar sea, then we have nowhere to look but unto Him.

#### Why the Calm is Necessary

- (a) We are not designed for continual suffering. If we were, Jesus wouldn't have given us peace (John 14:27)
- (b) We often have a sense of helplessness about where Jesus has led us. And sometimes reassurance can only come through calm (Jeremiah 29:11).
- (3) Because the resources we discover in the raging waters are the same resources we need when the storm has passed.

"As they sailed, he fell asleep" (23) --- "Who is this? He commands even the winds and the water, and they obey Him" (25).

#### Two Resources We Discover In the Raging Waters

Jesus' Humanity for Identification - He was fast asleep on hard boards that only great weariness could make comfortable.

Jesus' Divinity for Reverence - "Who is this?"

(4) Because divine care never takes a break, even when it leads to rough waters He got up and rebuked the wind and the raging waters; the storm subsided, and all was calm

#### Isaiah 43:2

"So when you pass through the waters, I will be with you. And when you pass through the rivers, they will not sweep over you. When you walk through the fire, you will not be burned."

#### Charles Spurgeon

"Come then, ye tremblers, ye doubters, ye little ones, ye that think ye cannot have a part in the promise, come now, nestle down under those great wings as though they were bars of iron, through which no storms of trouble can ever beat; through which the enemy, though he come from hell itself, shall not be able to drive his darts."

# Flowers A Scripture Reading – Matthew 6:25-34 "See how the flowers of the field grow." Matthew 6:28
