My Dear Children
Redeeming Simplicity: 1 John #2
1 John 2:1-11

Have you ever noticed the amount of times Jesus and the New Testament writers introduced their material with phrases like this one: “my dear children”? There’s a reason for it I often miss. I’m at my best spiritually and as a person created in the image of God when I recognize how I’m viewed by God. I am His child and will always be. When I recognize that first, I become open and malleable to receive what follows in the way it’s intended: for my benefit, growth, and productivity. That’s the heart of John today as we begin chapter 2 of 1 John.

What Every Child of God Needs to Hear:

1. You have an advocate (2:1-2)

The Defense Attorney - Our Concept

The Guilt Attorney - John’s Concept

Significance - Jesus “for us” Greater Than We Realize

2. You can be sure (2:3-5)

Assurance of Salvation - a Lifestyle of Obedience

Doubts of Salvation (for good reason) - a Lifestyle of Disobedience

How to obey - start small

Walking with God because he is God (Enoch)

Pondering - to weigh in the mind, to think or reflect, especially quietly and deeply (Mary)

3. You have a perfect hero to want to be like (2:6-8)

Willingness to lay down our lives for another (John 15:13)

Plight of others just as important as ours (1 Cor 13:5)

Regard for the afflicted (Luke 10:30-37)

Welcoming of the stranger (Matthew 25:43)

4. You are loved, and can love others the same way (2:9-11)

Love has no neutral capabilities

Love unexpressed is no love at all

Where love is absent, hate is present

Building Bridges to the Kingdom Matthew 25:31-34

Scripture refers to "the kingdom of God" frequently, but many people are unclear as to its meaning. Let's look at the past, present, and future reality of this concept.

The first thing we must realize is that the heavenly kingdom refers to everything under Christ's control. At the moment of salvation, we are transferred from the reign of darkness to the bright authority of Jesus. And we are eternally secure in Him.

As today's verses explain, Jesus' kingdom and reign have been planned since the foundation of the world. From the beginning, God has been preparing mankind for what is to come. One way was by using prophets to foretell how He would redeem humanity and sovereignly rule over heaven and earth.

Once Jesus came and gave His life, He established the "present" kingdom. This isn't a geographical locale; it's a term describing the heart, where God's Holy Spirit indwells believers to guide, counsel, and empower.

But there is also a future aspect of the kingdom, which we can anticipate with excitement. You are probably familiar with the words "Thy kingdom come" from the Lord's Prayer (Luke 11:2 kjv). This speaks of the new heaven and new earth, where we will enjoy freedom from pain and sin. There, we will worship Jesus with gladness and joy for all eternity.
